History of Homestead Community Organizations

- 1904: Homestead Hall built (155 Linden Lane)
- 1934: Brown's Hall built on Miller Avenue (Buddhist Temple)
- 1934: HV Progressive Club formed
- 1951: HV Improvement Club formed
- 1958: HV Community Association articles of incorporation
- 1967: CSA-14 Established After-school childcare programs
- 1972: Brown's Hall sold to the Buddhist Temple of Marin
- 1975: HVCA buys former Call property at 315 Montford



Key Event in 1973: Open Space Bond Issue


September 18, 1973: Homestead residents voted 79% in favor of obtaining \$600K (=\$4.2M today) in bond funds for purchasing land in Homestead Valley.
In addition to open space, community leaders recognized the need for a new community center located within Homestead Valley.



New Community Center for Homestead Valley

- The strong vote for the open space bonds set the stage for a successful request for direct matching funds from the County to buy a new community center in Homestead Valley.
- Combining bond revenue, funds from the sale of Browns's Hall, and matching funds from the County, the Call property at 315 Montford was purchased to become the HV Community Center.
- The Community settled on keeping the Meadow as an open space after deliberations about building tennis courts there.
